



USA ARCHERY LEVEL 1 INSTRUCTOR TRAINING

Level 1: Saturday September 21st, 2019

The Level 1 archery instructor course is for adults and youth 16 years of age or older*. It is a one-day course which is most closely associated with a “grassroots” program that is short-term in scope. The course requires that you demonstrate how to do a new archer safety briefing and you must pass a 50 question written exam in order to obtain the certification. The level 1 course content includes range safety, range setup, basic equipment setup and repair, and how to teach the basic steps of shooting. Those who successfully complete the Level 1 course will be able to:

- Run a BSA archery range;
- Run a Cub Scout archery range at the District or Council level;
- Teach the 4-hour BSA Cub Scout Archery Range Officer course, certifying other adult Scouters to run a Cub Scout archery range. i.e., Day Camp, at the District or Council level; and
- Counsel archery merit badge for Boy Scouts.

Courses will start promptly at 8 a.m. and end at 5pm. The cost of the **Level 1 course is \$80.00**. Your course fee includes all course materials, and equipment. You are welcome to bring your own archery equipment for use during the class. For those who do not own their own archery equipment, it will be provided. It is recommended that participants bring a bag lunch as most carry out options are some distance away.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE FOR THE COURSE IS September 6th. SIGN UP EARLY AS SPACE IS LIMITED. Once registered, you will receive an email confirmation with directions to the range, instructions on where to meet and what to bring. This course is weather permitting so dress accordingly. In case of inclement weather, you will be notified 24 hours ahead of time of any cancellation. *USA Archery permits 16-year-old level 1 instructors but BSA requires archery range instructors be at least 18 years of age.
